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
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

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## How much do you earn?

The best and worst cities for painters and decorators to work in the United Kingdom have been highlighted in a new survey. Workwear specialists MI Supplies analysed the yearly pay for painters and decorators in every city in the UK. Their research shows which cities you can earn the most and least money from working in if you are in the painting and decorating trade.

They discovered that Bradford is the best city in the UK for painters and decorators to make a living. The average pay for those working in Bradford is £24,040. London comes is in second place with an average £23,889 per annum wage.

Painters and decorators working in Cambridge and Newport, meanwhile, have the lowest yearly salaries. They both came at the bottom of the list with £19,434 the average wage for Cambridge painters and decorators, and £19,602 for those in Newport.

The average wages for painters and decorators have increased by 8% since 2013. There is also a £4,606 difference between the average pay for painters and decorators working in Bradford compared to the lowest earning UK city Cambridge.

The five best places to make a living in the United Kingdom as a painter and decorator are:

- 2. **London** £23,889
- 3. **Gloucester** £23,640
- 4. **Salisbury** £21,320
- 5. **Aberdeen** £21,190

Meanwhile, the five worst are:

- 4. **Leicester** £19,636
- 5. **Derby** £19,995

MI Supplies analysed the yearly salaries for painters and decorators with at least five years of experience across all 69 cities in the UK.

Once sorted, the PCW plastic is turned into

individual pellets which are then dyed and moulded to create Crown's 2.5 litre and 5 litre paint containers, with the dark grey shade making them instantly recognisable to consumers.

The paint containers, which will soon be rolled out across the entire Crown Paints range including its larger 10 litre tubs and Crown Trade products, are also fully recyclable once empty and clean. With such sustainability credentials, the new paint cans are the ideal choice for today's environmentally conscious consumers.

#### Tragic fall leads to avoidable death

The need for proper planning and supervision of work at height activities has been tragically highlighted with the death of Justin Newitt, who fell five meters through an opening on the roof at Maidstone Studios Limited.

The incident happened after Mr Newitt accessed the roof using a mobile access tower that was intended for performing works below, not for climbing on to the roof. However, no formal planning had been recorded and there was no supervision on how the work was being carried out.

The conviction of Maidstone Studios Limited featured in a recent Health and Safety Executive (HSE) press release, which also illustrated a lack of planning with regards to the condition the tower:

"The tower scaffold used to access the roof was damaged, had not been correctly erected and had been purchased second hand by Maidstone Studios Limited with no manufacturer's instructions.

No-one identified the errors with the towers, ladder sections being the wrong way around, damaged bracing or the inadequate guardrails."

The release also highlighted that Mr Newitt was not trained to erect the tower safely.

Maidstone Studios Limited has been ordered to pay over £36,000 in fines and costs for breaching the relevant sections of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974.

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

#### Stormdry EPC helps meet energy standards

Safeguard Europe has developed a system to improve the energy efficiency of solid-walled properties. The launch of Stormdry EPC comes as the new Minimum Energy Efficiency Standards (MEES) relating to rented properties have taken effect. The new standards, which originate in The Energy Act 2011, say that from April 1st this year any commercial or residential property that is being let for the first time, or where a lease is renewed, must achieve an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) of Grade E or above.

Historically, properties with solid walls, rather than cavities, have been the most difficult and challenging to insulate. Typically for these properties, 54% of their heat goes through their walls, a figure which can rise for end-of-terrace homes or bungalows.

The system combines two Safeguard technologies to treat a wall both inside and



out: Stormdry masonry cream and a 'skinny' IWI panel. The result is a system which reduces the U-value of a damp, uninsulated masonry wall from 1.7 W/m2K down to 0.87 W/m2K.

For a typical mid-terrace property with uninsulated solid walls that has an EPC rating of F, the application of the Stormdry EPC alone would be sufficient to move it up to the E rating required under MEES. For a ground floor flat or a small semi-detached


house, the E rating could be achieved with very minor additional investment such as an insulating jacket for the boiler, energy efficient lighting and draft sealing.

Stormdry masonry cream can be applied with brush or roller to brick, mortar, sandstone or concrete. It provides a breathable membrane, coating the inside of the pores of the substrate so that water can evaporate out through it but cannot penetrate in. This means that, unlike some competitor products, it can be applied to wet walls because it will allow the water to evaporate out.

The IWI comes in 13mm-thick flexible panels which can be stuck straight onto existing walls. It is made from an aerogel, which has extremely low thermal conductivity due to its highly porous nature. Its super-slim profile means that a room's dimensions are barely diminished and that period features do not have to be sacrificed.







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## **Malachite**

Malachite is Copper Carbonate, typically associated with copper deposits around limestones, the source of the carbonate. It forms most commonly in stalactites and botryoidal formations; botryoidal comes from the Greek and means resembling a bunch of grapes. You can see pictures of Botryoidal Malachite carved vases in the Hermitage Museum, Malachite Room, these huge pieces are rare. More often the mineral is cut and pieced together like a mosaic. When I first started in this industry Malachite was a standard finish that you learned. Classed among the "Bravura" Finishes it went with Lapis Lazuli and Tortoiseshell. In the 90's these fell out of fashion. So Malachite went on my business back burner. The past 2 years I've started to see it creep into interior design. Malachite wallpaper, rugs and upholstery fabrics and this tells me it's back!! It's the easiest of all the Bravura finishes and a great finish to use as an inlay or border; it makes a stunning table-top and I did a lovely fireplace, years back, in fragmented malachite for Colefax and Fowler.



Materials used were – The eggshell basecoat for the first piece was Benjamin Moore's Floradale Isle 581, similar to BS14 E 53, the second was Benjamin Moore Harbor Side Blue 740. The glaze was the same for both - Fusion Clear Glaze tinted with Phthalo Green and Lamp Black thinned about 10% with water. You could use Polyvine with tints Emerald, Prussian Blue and Black but I wanted to try this glaze out. I found it a nice glaze to use with a very good

open time. The main tool is bits of card. I've found that old shiny greetings cards are best, although I'm sure you could use anything to hand and get interesting results. You will need a laying on brush and some rag.

**Stage 1** For the freeform Botryoidal Malachite done first I laid the glaze on and created some rough ideas of shapes with the brush to give me a compositional guideline and to thin and even out the glaze a bit. Because you are scraping through the glaze it





leaves ridges – too thick a ridge will take a long time to dry. Fold the card and tear straight edged pieces that are varied in size. Draw the torn edge of the card through the glaze creating interesting malachite style shapes. Wipe off the card after each pass. One bit of card will work brilliantly while the next won't and equally your brilliant bit will become soggy and stop working so you need to have lots of bits to work with. Some people cut teeth into the card, however I find this ends up looking a bit repetitive and it's time consuming.

**Stage 2** The fragmented design in a more teal colour with lightly broken bronze grout is a modern twist. Draw up your design of fragments in water

colour pencil, this will dissolve as you paint. Mask up alternate shapes and carry out the same process. For this you might want to dilute the glaze further to encourage drying as it has to be carried out over 3-4 phases. I used a hairdryer to speed the drying and the Tesa Pink masking tape as this won't damage freshly painted sections.

**Stage 3** Once your piece is complete varnish to protect with a semi-gloss or high gloss varnish.

I first learned this technique 32 years ago at The Pardon School of Specialist Decoration. Leonard Pardon sadly died earlier this year and I wrote this with his memory in mind.

n today's hygiene conscious world, surfaces need to be ultra clean and walls and ceilings are no exception. Whether part of a standard clean up in a domestic property or a more intensive maintenance programme in a school or healthcare facility, a common problem of regular and rigorous cleaning is that it can wear away the paint finish and leave décor looking tired. To overcome this, manufacturers such as Crown Trade have invested heavily in the development of paints that can not only be wiped clean, but can be repeatedly scrubbed over

longer periods without any detriment to the appearance of the paint.

So how do they work? Cleanable paints such as Crown Trade's Clean Extreme range have been specially developed and tested to be able to withstand intensive cleaning by minimising the amount of paint film that is removed each time.

Based upon the ISO 11998 testing method, which is the industry standard for determining the wet scrub resistance of dry paint film, Crown Trade's Clean Extreme Scrubbable Matt achieved a Class

1 rating and has a durability level of 10,000 scrubs, which translates to a 400 per cent increase in resistance to wet scrubbing when compared to conventional matt emulsions.

Although they have been specifically formulated to be repeatedly cleaned, the best products on the market are those that actively prevent stains appearing in the first place too. Choosing a product that is both scrubbable and stain resistant can offer the best of both worlds and may actually help extend time between



cleaning. Paints that contain built-in protection that can't simply be washed away also provide additional peace of mind and are particularly suited for areas that need to be kept as hygienic as possible.

Even when surfaces look clean, they can be a breeding ground for bacteria. Historically, anti-bacterial paints have been prone to the problem of leaching, which is when the organic or chemical antibacterial agents migrate to the surface of the paint film over time where they can be wiped away. However manufacturers have developed products which offer protection that can't be washed off no matter how many times the surface is scrubbed clean. For example, Crown Trade's Clean Extreme Anti-Bacterial Scrubbable Matt utilises the natural protection of silver ion technology, which not only inhibits the growth of any bacteria that comes into contact with the surface but also prevents bacteria from multiplying.

Another common problem is mould and mildew which if painted over without treatment, will simply come back. For specific problems areas, it is worth considering a paint such as Crown Trade's Clean Extreme Mould Inhibiting Scrubbable Matt which is not only stain resistant but contains an active fungicide to prevent the growth of mould on the paint film.

The high performance formulation of cleanable paints has led them to be regarded as specialist paint solutions but in fact the wide range of benefits they can offer makes them ideally suited to a variety of different projects.

Paints that can be scrubbed and repeatedly cleaned are extremely effective when used in high traffic areas such as corridors or hallways in private







and rental homes or busy school and office environments. Extending the life of the paint finish is another key benefit and this can bring long term savings by reducing the number of future redecoration cycles.

Using anti-mould paints as a precautionary measure in rooms such as kitchens and bathrooms which are prone to condensation can also help avoid any long term and potential costly problems in the future. Similarly, using anti-mould paints in the residential rental sector, particularly in void properties that are likely to empty and unheated for some time, will help keep interior décor looking cleaner and fresher for longer.

Additionally, although anti-bacterial paints are often marketed for use in hospitals and other healthcare projects, they are becoming increasingly popular in other areas where improved hygiene is beneficial, such as food preparation facilities and children's play rooms.

As well as offering targeted solutions to specific problems such as stains, mould and bacteria, the flexibility offered by cleanable paints is helping to fuel their popularity. Many, such as Crown Trade's Clean Extreme water-based range, are available in both high performance matt and acrylic eggshell finishes and a wide range of colours to offer excellent design versatility. 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# Just what can be in paint By Dr. Tim Yeomans

People with asthma and allergies are advised to avoid volatile organic compounds but this is not always possible. If you are painting at the home of someone in certain circumstances these can be unavoidable. When carrying out necessary tasks such as painting the home, how can you reduce their exposure and what should you be looking out for in your paint?

e all know that organic solvents are the main source of VOCs in paint and are the carrier in solvent based coatings. But what about water based paints?

#### What chemicals are in paint?

Water-based paints were created in response to demand for healthier and greener paint options and naurally have significantly lower solvent and VOC content but with the removal of solvent from paint, certain functional properties need to be replaced with substitute compounds.

Microorganisms can't grow in cans of solvent based paints, therefore water-based paints, require a preservative to suppress any significant microbial growth. In 2017, a well known paint company removed a preservative from a paint line that was on sale in an independent DIY chain. Unfortunately, as this was a water



based paint, this removal allowed bacteria to grow in the paint cans. When the paint was applied to walls, it resulted in a smell that was compared to cat urine and rotten animals! This smell was due to the production of ammonia and hydrogen sulphide by bacteria in the paint cans. However there are certain additives that can create problems for the vulnerable. These include:

#### **Formaldehyde**

Formaldehyde is added to paint to inhibit bacterial and fungal growth. However there are several health concerns with respect to the off-gassing of formaldehyde from freshly painted indoor surfaces. An increase in formaldehyde and VOC levels after painting correlates with asthma and bronchial hyper-responsiveness. A relation between nocturnal attacks of



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Large sanding areas and large quantities of dust place a great amount of strain on the main filter, which in turn affects the suction power. Mineral sanding dust from renovation sanders or long-reach sanders such as RENOFIX and PLANEX clogs the pores of the filter system and consequently reduces the suction power.

The CT pre-separator separates and collects approx. 80% of the accruing quantity of dust before it reaches the mobile dust extractor. This takes the strain off the main filter and guarantees consistently high suction power throughout the entire work process.

breathlessness and indoor concentrations of formaldehyde and VOCs in the home was also found. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recognised that everyone is exposed to small amount of formaldehyde in the air, and exposure can cause irritation of the eyes, nose and throat and neurological effects.

#### Acetaldehyde

Acetaldehyde is added to paint as a binder. Although it is also present in the environment in low levels, and is even produced in the body after the breakdown of alcohol, exposure to acetaldehyde offgassing can cause irritation of the eyes, skin and respiratory tract. Acetaldehyde is also a specific inducer of airway hyperresponsiveness in asthmatic patients.

#### Mercury

Phenylmercuric acetate is used as a preservative to prolong the shelf life of paint by inhibiting the growth of bacteria and fungus in water-based paints. In one particular published case, a child exposed to paint fumes in his home for 10 days was hospitalized with acrodynia, a form of mercury poisoning. A follow up study investigated homes painted with the same brand of paint and found increased mercury concentrations in the urine of inhabitants. The particular brand of paint contained 2 1/2 times the EPA recommended limit for mercury. Phenylmercuric acetate has been banned for use in paint in several markets including the European Union and the USA.

#### **PGE**

Water based paints can contribute to a lower overall VOC exposure, however a study in 2010 showed a correlation between PGEs (propylene glycol and glycol ethers) and greater risk of developing asthma and allergic diseases. PGE is a VOC that has a lower volatility than other VOCs, and still performs very well as a solvent. For this reason it can be used in water based paints in order to reduce the overall VOC levels, but nevertheless has its own exposure concerns.

Significant innovation has occurred in the



paint sector in the last decade, including better formulation technologies and new additive options. These have facilitated the development of more sustainable paints that can perform on par with traditional solvent based products.

The production of more sustainable, 'healthier' paints has been in response both to consumer pressure, and tighter regulations around the VOC content of paints. Following application, paints can continue to emit VOCs as they dry. Standardised testing for the determination of the VOC profile of paint, measures emission at specified time points eg 24, 48 and 96 hours. While most people would ventilate a room well while they are painting, ventilation may be required for a period of time after the paint has actually been applied.

Several programs exist that test paint and provide a certification mark, based on the paints' compliance with their testing standard. As well as determining relative safety, these certification marks may also measure performance of the paint.

#### **Green Seal**

The Green Seal Certification for paints assesses these products on the basis of environmental impact. It includes testing for performance, health and



environmental requirements, endof-life management, packaging and labelling requirements. In terms of health aspects, there are a range of chemicals that are banned, and limits are defined of VOCs in the paint product, as well as once applied and emitted.

#### UL Environment – Greenguard

Greenguard certification is primarily focussed on promoting healthier indoor environments and was first established to

assist EPA purchasing decisions. The Greenguard certification for



paint, tests for total VOC levels in the paint, as well as emissions over time. This standard is primarily focussed on air quality and does not measure performance characteristics.

#### Scientific Certification Systems (SCS)

The SCS Indoor Advantage Gold is also focused on indoor air quality. Compliance with this certification standard is

measured based on indoor air quality modelling and VOC emission over time. Similarly to the UL Environment standard,



the SCS Certification does not address performance characteristics of the paint.

#### asthma & allergy friendly®

The asthma & allergy friendly®
Certification Program is operated by
Allergy Standards Ltd in collaboration with
the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of
America, Asthma Canada and is also
operated internationally through a global
certification mark. Paint certification is
based on the impact on the indoor

environment for those suffering from asthma and allergies. The programme assesses



the chemical constituents of the paint for toxins and allergens, as well as testing VOC emissions over an extended time course. Finally the physical performance characteristics are measured to ensure the quality of the product.

# Drawing Spainting faux bricks

By Lynda Bergman

Recently, I've been working for a builder who is building Orleans style house for a client. The builder had one area that bothered him and couldn't decide what to do with it.



Finally, he had an idea and called me to ask if I could paint faux bricks for him in this area. So, I did paint faux/trompe I'oeil bricks for him. To the left are three walls with bricks. Can you tell which two walls are real and the one that I painted?





#### Ok, which one?

Alright, I'm sure you've guessed it. The butler's pantry was very plain and the builder wanted me to paint the faux bricks to blend with the other two walls. When you're standing in certain areas in the big living room you can see all three brick walls at the same time. It was important to make them look the same.

I'm very happy with the way they turned out. Everybody was saying, "oh that looks good, you did it," and that made me feel good. The builder helped me with critiquing the grout lines, and together, WE DID IT!

#### **TUTORIAL**

First, I used dry spackling. With a broad knife and my finger I lightly textured the area.

I picked out colours to match the existing brick and mortar colours. I painted the grayish grout color over the whole area as my base coat. When that dried, I used my brick stencil to get the structure going.

Next, I used a regular brush to stencil the orange brick.

Then, I used a brush to paint on and a rag to rub out raw umber, off white and black. It took a while to work on each brick and make them different from each other. Last, I went back with a brush to paint the grout lines a little wider. As the paint was wet, I wiped with a rag and smudged areas onto each brick to match the existing real brick walls.

At the very bottom and at the very top I had to make my own bricks because the stencil wouldn't fit in those spots. The bricks are so uneven it's very simple to do. In the corners, I lightly brushed some raw umber so it shadowed, making it look more three dimensional. I think anyone could do this. You could paint the wall behind fireplaces, the backsplash under kitchen cabinets, a bedroom wall or any place you wish you had bricks. You can use any color for your bricks and mortar.








What you do get is a powerful circular saw without being tied to a flex and a power source. No worries about needing 110v tool on site but you do lose a little depth of cut. A lightweight for a cordless saw.







he New Citroen Relay arrived for me to put through its paces with virtually every extra the Citroen offered. Its fun using them but one does wonder if many bosses would be inclined to spend the extra. There are some that can and will in the long run save money. The rear facing camera will save the odd expensive and time wasting effects of a bump. The GPS will save a lot of time and map reading and asking the way for the driver.

The Relay has good design features that will save on repair bills. The front bumper for instance is in three parts so an unfortunate minor 'coming into contact' will not mean the replacement of the whole part.

In the driver's seat you get an excellent commanding view of the road with superb double rear view mirrors. The seat is reasonably comfortable and adjustable for most shapes of drivers. Steering is light and responsive and the column stalks give you as

usual the indicators, lights, cruise control, speed limiter and wipers.

On the steering wheel you can alter the volume of the entertainment and phone. I found the gear change a trifle lumpy but its position was good. The cabin sports 13 storage spaces and cubby holes. Over the screen is a cab wide shelf, the back of the middle seat can be lowered to reveal a table for your lap top. On top of the dash is a

'lectern' where you can clip the paperwork, delivery note etc.

There is not an automatic version just the six speed box used throughout the range, so those with auto only licences need not apply. The

handbrake is on the right of the driver's seat, not the most common place but it soon becomes familiar.

There are three seats in the Relay. The middle one can be eliminated and a nice full sized one, its a no cost option, fitted for those who only carry two staff and travel long distances. For those sitting in the middle seat there is an assembly of cup holders near the floor where the middle seat

passenger would like to put their feet and would make for an uncomfortable ride.

On the motorway I found that one could soon get into trouble as the 160hp diesel is very powerful and the 70mph limit can be easily exceeded. On the test Relay there's an alarm that tells you if you are too close to the lane markings. This feature can be switched off where the lanes are narrow in the case of road works as there incessant sounding off can be irritating.

The main purpose of a van is to carry stuff and payload capacities across the range from 1,115kg to 1,900kg and volumes of 8 to 17 cubic metres. The load space in the Relay is one of the widest with 1,422mm between the wheel arches and 1,870mm load space width. A Europallet fits nice and flat and can also be loaded through the 1,250mm side door.

The Relay uses the same underpinnings as the Peugeot and Fiat offerings although Fiat have a different range of engines. All in all a class act but it has to be said the Relay lacks the street cred of Ford's Transit or the Sprinter from Mercedes.
